Reading Rule
 ☆ CVCe: When a word ends in an e and has one other vowel, the e is silent and the other vowel is usually long.

Reading Rule
 ☆ Words with endings: To read a word with an ending, cover the ending. If there is only one consonant before the ending, the vowel sound is usually long.

Spelling Rule
 ☆ CVCe plus ending: When a word ends in a silent e, drop the e and then add the ending.
